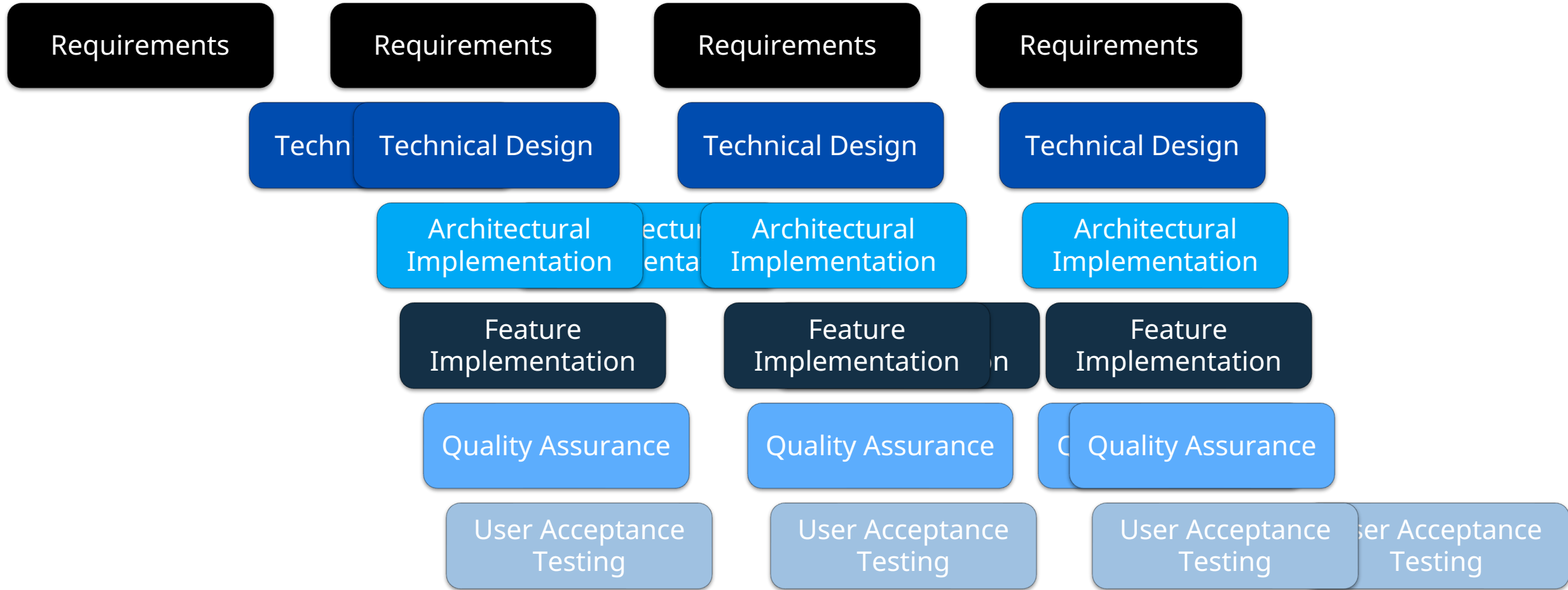
Which Comes at a Cost

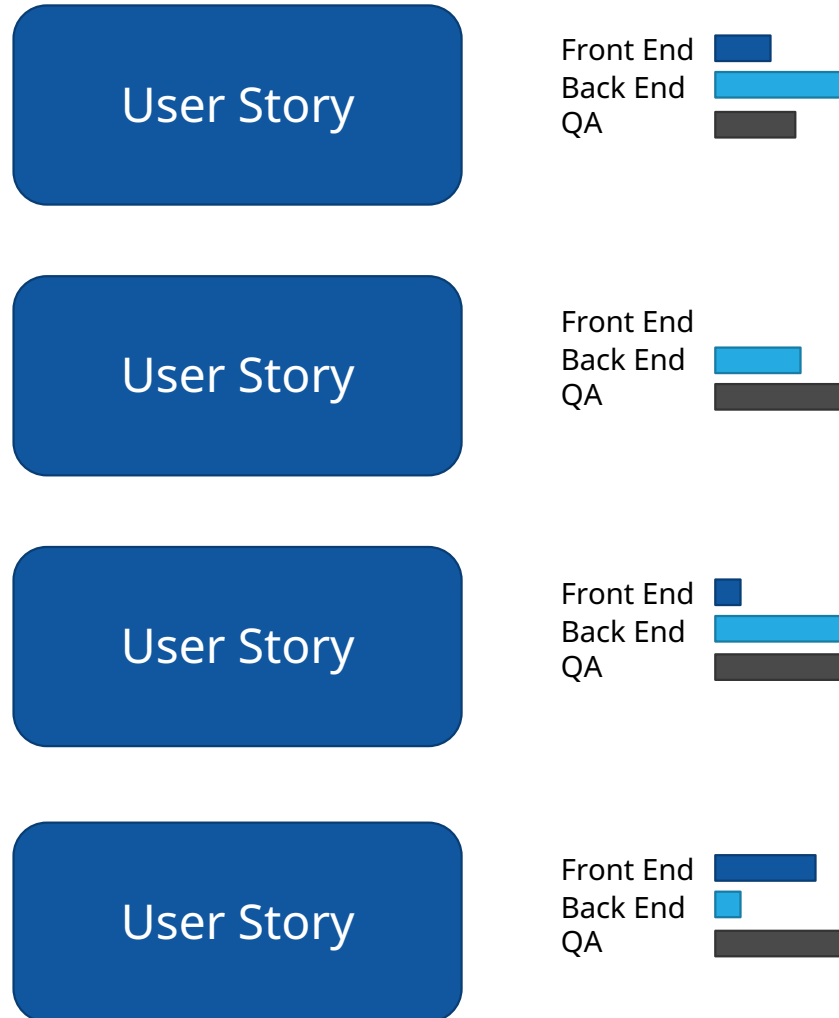

The Problem



Without a T-Shaped Team

- No swarming
- Stories don't get done
- Focus moves into the backlog
- "I don't have anything to work on"

A Perspective on Team Members

- This is OK:
 - “Emily is the **best** person to do this work.”
- Not OK:
 - “Emily is the **only** person who can do this work.”

The T-Shaped Team

Benefits

- **The ability to “swarm”**
- Risk management
 - Specialist gets sick
 - Or is on vacation

Navigator

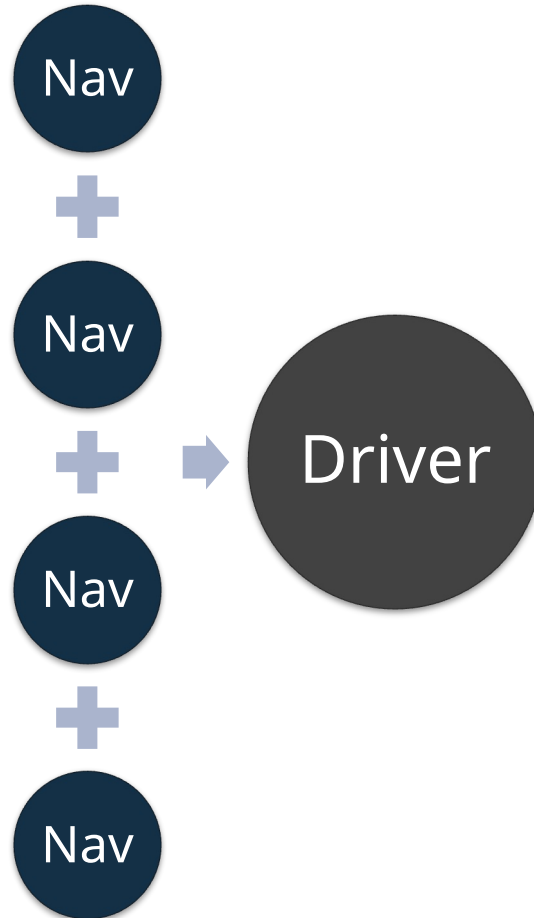
- More Experienced
